- Expand the AAUN PRDF & attract new resources from governments / agencies
- Introduce an Africa-Australia mobility fund to fuel development of new research partnerships. Emphasise the advancement of early career researchers and women
- Introduce a two-way research capacity building & training program
- Promote & engage in the Australia Awards Africa scholarship programs
- Provide support for African graduates / Awardees returning from international training or research programs
- Produce a series of policy position papers on our five key areas of engagement
- Engage with industry, government & civil society through joint projects, conferences / events on joint Australia-Africa challenges



AAUN Partnerships & Research Development Fund (PRDF)

- ☐ The PRDF annual competitive catalytic grants of \$AUD 10,000 to foster partnerships across the network, including new members, and support planning workshops and research collaborations that address distinct mutual challenges.
- ☐ The PRDF provides one year of catalytic seed funding with the firm expectation that funded projects will be excellent, build specialist teams, achieve impact and be sustainable through the early identification of additional external funding.
